This year has seen an epic collection of work done by AMICAn Terry Smythe - Completed! - the conversion of every AMICA Bulletin published is now available to Members on our "Members-Only" section of the website. This project, gifted to AMICA from Terry, has spanned several years of laboriously scanning and correcting every page to be as true to the original as possible. Accompanying this work is a fully searchable index to assist you in finding any author or title name in this vast collection. We hope that someday there will be an easy tool to allow any member to search for articles using 'keywords'.

Also notable additions have been in the LITERATURE section of the Members-Only area. Terry has scanned documents belonging to him or otherwise are borrowed, providing high quality replications of various literature published by Manufacturers. Many new additions have been installed on our website.
